Masonic Spotlight

Bro. John Elway Denver Bronco-Hall of Fame Quarterback



John Albert Elway, Jr., was born in Port Angeles, Washington, on June 28, 1960.

Brother John Elway, had a career that spanned from 1983 to 1999. Elway's career totals include 4,123 completions; 51,475 yards passing; and 300 TD passes in regular season play; plus 3,407 yards rushing and 33 touchdowns scored. His playoff and Super Bowl statistics would add some 355 more completions

and 4,964 yards and 27 touchdown passes.

John Elway's attainments on the football field speak for themselves. He ranks third among all NFL quarterbacks in passes attempted and completed, and fourth in touchdown passes. Elway entered the National 'Football League Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, in 2004

Elway was raised during a two day class put on by the Grand Lodge of Colorado on February 22 and 23 of 2002. He is a Perpetual Member (also termed a life member) of South Denver Lodge No.93
